

Growth & Progress The Harvest Foundation

he Harvest Foundation is two years into its five-year strategic plan journey — a time marked by substantial growth and progress for Martinsville-Henry County. The foundation's initiatives, fueled by "hope," fit within three significant priority areas: Thriving Youth, A Vibrant Community, and a Resilient and Diverse Economy.

These three areas represent the cross-sections of the foundation's community-led plan to serve all citizens of Martinsville-Henry County. Harvest's plan is no different from other strategic plans in that it's not meant to sit on a shelf. This plan is active and fluid, changing based on learning and community needs.

When faced with the necessity to increase childcare capacity and grow the pipeline of workers in early childhood education, Harvest worked closely with MHC Partners for Children (formerly Smart Beginnings Martinsville-Henry County) to add three new childcare centers and expand two existing centers, creating 135 new childcare slots and adding 17 new staff to the workforce. Tuition assistance supported 50 individuals working to gain credentials in early childhood education, and the Back Office Support pilot program provided technical assistance to childcare providers to alleviate issues caused by workforce shortages and increased administrative responsibilities.

With a focus on healthy individuals and families, Harvest funding supported the Piedmont Adult Drug Treatment Court, which expanded its capacity to serve clients within Martinsville and Henry County jurisdictions. Connect Health + Wellness launched a new telepsychiatry program that increased its capacity for behavioral health patients by 40 percent.

Updated housing opportunities include new apartments across Martinsville and Henry County and singlefamily homes in the Five Points Neighborhood in Martinsville. City and County leadership consistently hosts developers and entrepreneurs with potential partnerships and investment opportunities. Increasing jobs and the local tax base, while ensuring entrepreneurs have support and access to resources, remains a priority. Press Glass, a global glass fabricator located within the Commonwealth Crossing Business Centre, announced the largest business expansion in Henry County's history in August 2023. An additional 335 jobs and the addition of 360,000 square feet to its facility is possible thanks in part to a \$2 million Harvest investment.

The Minority Business Consortium received a \$50,000 planning grant from the Virginia Main Street Virginia Business District Resurgence program to build capacity among local minority business owners. Harvest is working with the group to grow the program's opportunities for minority business owners in MHC.

Work continues at Harvest and with its partners to understand poverty and mitigate its effects in Martinsville-Henry County. A health equity report, released in September 2023, explores MHC's health, education levels, income, housing, and access to transportation and healthy food by census tract. Nonprofits and other organizations can use this data to better understand the needs of different parts of the community to best deploy limited resources.

Hope is Harvest's path forward. It's a reminder that Martinsville-Henry County is a strong and resilient community with a storied past and an even brighter future. Project Hope, launched in 2022 in celebration of the foundation's 20th anniversary, is a small grants opportunity designed to fund small, grassroots projects that bring hope to communities.

This is a chance for anyone in Martinsville-Henry County to share their hope and help their community on their terms. Since 2022, Project Hope has awarded nearly \$136,000 in grant funds to 14 volunteer-led projects.

- HCPS's Career Academy is preparing students to be workforce ready through its partnerships with local industry. In its first year, 90% of graduating seniors earned a state license or industry certificate. The Career Academy has been recognized as an Apple Distinguished School for the 2023– 2026 program term.
- Magna Vista and Bassett High Schools are the homes of Virginia's FIRST New Tech Network academies. Warrior Tech Academy at Magna Vista and Bengal Tech Academy at Bassett offer students a rigorous project-based curriculum of study and practice that are fun, engaging and expected for 21st century learners.

For over 60 years, Patrick & Henry Community College has been the launching pad for thousands of successful entrepreneurs, healthcare workers, welders, teachers, and so many others. Whether a student is coming to learn a new skill, to transfer to a four-year institution, or to land a dream career, P&HCC is the gateway to their goals. For students looking to launch a career, P&HCC can help them connect with potential employers by arranging internships and interviews. For students looking to transfer to a four-year university, P&HCC offers dozens of guaranteed transfer pathways.

No matter the student's goal, P&HCC works to ensure anyone can access the programs they need. One way P&HCC does this is by reducing financial barriers. Thanks to a \$10.3 million donation from the Harvest Foundation, every high school graduate in Martinsville and Henry County can attend P&HCC at no cost. For others, scholarships and grants like the governor's G3 program and the college's P&H Scholars program could also cover tuition costs.

P&HCC is also making college more accessible to the community by expanding to new and more convenient locations. The college opened the second building in its Manufacturing, Engineering and Technology (MET) Complex in 2023, tripling its welding program capacity. The building also houses the heavy equipment operator and precision machining programs. In 2019, P&HCC opened two new sites in Patrick County, making P&HCC's popular welding program and career and technical programs more accessible to Patrick County students. P&HCC is also making college more accessible by enabling students to start early. With a dual enrollment program funded by the National Science Foundation, students can earn three-quarters of their engineering technology associate degree before graduating high school.

With tailor-made programs, abundant funding opportunities, and strategic locations, Patrick & Henry Community College is removing the barriers that keep the people it serves from getting the opportunities they deserve. For six decades, P&HCC has been a pathway to growth and success for countless community members in MHC.

Stepping up to the Next Level Blue Ridge Regional Airport

lue Ridge Regional Airport, Jason Davis said he can see the light at the end of the tunnel. "It's real — it's tangible," Davis said. "Looking to the west end (of the airport), you can see dust, equipment, and physical bare dirt. Now, we have something that puts us on the radar. People know that the airport is growing and moving in the right direction. We're limited now, but with our (runway) extension, we take those limits off. Then we really have something to work with."

Coming off the successful construction of an extended ramp (apron), which quadrupled parking space, Davis said they look forward to finishing work to move the western portion of the road (phase 3), which will lead to phase 4, constructing the runway extension.

"Extending our runway to 6,000 feet puts us in league with Stafford and Pulaski — there are only a few of us regional, non-carrier airports that can offer that capability," Davis said. "This is stepping Martinsville-Henry County up to the next level and offering a first-class experience."

Davis said they hope to finish moving the road by the spring or early summer of 2024 and start the runway expansion project in the summer, finishing up by the following summer in 2025. If everything goes to plan, Davis said they may be able to begin phase 5, constructing a new terminal building, in conjunction with the runway expansion project.

After completion, estimated for mid-2026, Davis said he expects they will need to add staff to accommodate user needs. "There's no question, and we're happy to do it," he said. "We will expand our staffing needs as we continue to grow. That's a nice 'problem' to have."

He expects the expansion to move Blue Ridge from a mid-volume airport to a largevolume airport in both traffic and size of aircraft. "We're going to see a significant increase in our numbers, which will have a positive impact on our local economy," Davis said.

To meet demand, Davis said they've had to build two additional 80-by-80-foot corporate hangars. He said they're looking to increase their base aircraft and bring in additional revenue.

Increasing capability and offering additional services is a huge part of success and sustainability, but Davis said it also takes local support from the community and spreading knowledge about how the airport contributes to Martinsville-Henry County's success.



"Learn about how we're a valued community partner, and tell your neighbors about us," Davis said. "We have medivac operators here, we offer services to the military and law enforcement that protect our community, and we provide a platform to transport life-saving organs to people who need them. I invite all members of our community to visit and see what we're all about — experience it for yourself."

Celebrating 50 Years of Progress Martinsville-Henry County SPCA

an you name a local organization that began operating from a shoebox in 1974 and thanks to a very involved community, is now a thriving hub offering life-saving services, educational programs and internships, and gap services for residents with financial barriers? As the SPCA celebrates our 50th anniversary in 2024, we invite the community to celebrate a half century of milestone achievements by visiting our campus at 132 Joseph Martin Highway to meet our staff and animals, tour the Louise R. Lester Spay & Neuter Clinic, visit our renovated dog park, and learn about our community programs, partnerships, and volunteer opportunities. We believe you will be inspired!

Our organization's fifty-year journey has taken us from evolution to revolution in terms of humane services and community programs and partnerships. The SPCA of Martinsville-Henry County was founded in 1974 by Alice Ann Blevins, Judy DeBusk, and other citizens who envisioned a community with a more progressive approach to animal welfare. To reduce the burden of animal care at the municipal pounds and find loving homes for found animals, these volunteers gathered around a kitchen table, working from a shoebox file using a simple volunteer telephone adoption system to connect homeless animals with loving homes. Through the generosity of local resident Louise R. Lester and other animal advocates, in 1992 the SPCA was able to purchase its first shelter, located in Collinsville and housing both cats and dogs. As time progressed, the facility struggled with flooding, faulty drainage, poor ventilation, and high euthanasia rates. Each time the area received more than 2" of rain in a day, the entire shelter had to be evacuated so animals would not have to stand in water! The situation was not sustainable, so the SPCA board engaged the community in a capital campaign to build a new facility on donated land. The community responded generously!

In 2007, the 9,500 square foot Shelly Frith Drane Adoption Center was opened on a beautiful, high-and-dry 11-acre campus! Additional space in our new facility and partnerships formed with other rescue organizations improved our adoption rate and the quality of life of shelter residents. A partnership with North Shore Animal League (one of the nation's largest no-kill rescue and adoption organizations) addressed the overwhelming number of puppies being surrendered to us by transporting them to highadoption demand areas (with spay/neuter services performed there) when our facility was full. This partnership enabled us to achieve no-kill status

and reduce spay/neuter expenses. Other, smaller rescue organizations partnered with us to place adult dogs when we were at capacity.

Following a decade in our new facility, it became apparent that there was a tremendous local need for reduced cost spay/neuter services, so in 2018 the SPCA partnered with 7 local veterinary practices to offer low cost spay/neuter vouchers. Community response was overwhelming: in theory, more animals could be fixed, but in reality, the demand was far greater than local private practices could absorb to meet the need. The problem worsened with the advent of COVID in 2020: the SPCA was transporting shelter animals up to three counties away to access timely surgeries for shelter animals (state law requires animals to be fixed prior to adoption) and appointments to redeem vouchers purchased by residents for owned animals were being scheduled months out. Our adoption rate slowed significantly, resulting in a reduction of animals we were able to in-take from the City of Martinsville and Henry County pounds. Although the SPCA is a no-kill facility, the municipal pounds are not, so the sad consequence was that adoptable animals were being euthanized in the municipal pounds.

A campaign was initiated to address this issue by funding an upfit of the Shelley Frith Drane Adoption Center facility to accommodate a surgical suite, acquire state licensures to operate a veterinary clinic, and hire a full-time veterinarian. Again, the community responded generously! A cornerstone grant was awarded by the Louise R. Lester Foundation, followed by grants from local foundations including the Harvest Foundation, Women In Philanthropy, Heavner-Frith Match Fund, Davis Memorial Fund, Elster Foundation, Darnell Foundation, Irving & Jett Groves Charitable Foundation, and the Colleen Hewitt Family Fund. Many local individual donors responded promptly to close the financial gap, enabling the Louise R. Lester Spay & Neuter Clinic to open its doors to the public January 2022.

The establishment of an in-house veterinary clinic has been a community game-changer in ways far beyond the anticipated benefits of addressing the veterinary needs of shelter animals and providing affordable and timely services to residents with

financial barriers. The clinic provides an educational platform for internships for local youth interested in pursuing careers in veterinary sciences, educating the next generation of humane professionals. Our partnership agreement with the Veterinary Teaching Hospital at Virginia Tech for three-week clinical rotations brings visibility to Martinsville-Henry County. Each vet intern has brought a specific area of expertise, adding value to our operation, and leaving with a deeper understanding of shelter medicine and a positive experience of the benefits of life in Martinsville-Henry County. The clinic also provides internship opportunities for Patrick & Henry Community College's veterinary assistant program and Henry Couty Public School System's Career Academy. In addition to normal clinic hours, two monthly walk-in wellness clinic days provide critical community humane education. We work closely with Henry County and City of Martinsville animal control officers to meet their needs in terms of animal welfare. It is unique and unusual for a shelter in a community of our size to operate a veterinary clinic, and it is a testament to the heart, soul and generosity of this community that we are able to maintain this valuable service, adding another gold star to the quality of life in Martinsville-Henry County.

The SPCA will kick-off our 50th anniversary celebration with a Critters Without Litters campaign, offering \$20 spay/neuter services (includes vaccination, microchip and humane education) to qualified low-income residents. In almost two years of operation, the clinic has "fixed" 3,225 animals (1,854 shelter and 1,371 public), proving to be an extremely effective tool in addressing a problem we have not been able to rescue our way out of in 50 years of service: a homeless pet population caused in large part by lack of access to affordable spay/neuter services and humane education. Our Critters Without Litters campaign will be a deeper dive into addressing this issue and achieving yet another milestone for our community. 

Partnering with Henry County Parks & Recreation Monogram - Smith River Sports Complex

t has been a summer of transition for the Monogram Foods Smith River Sports Complex.

On July 25, the Henry County Board of Supervisors approved the acquisition of the Sports Complex after the Southern Virginia Recreation Facilities Authority, which oversaw the facility, voted to dissolve.

The SRSC was constructed in 2008 and opened in the fall of 2009. The goal was to bring a sports facility to Martinsville that would help promote health and wellness for local residents, while also providing a boost to the economy through sports tourism. Henry County has made it known that mission has and will remain the same, and now both entities hope the mission becomes easier to achieve while building upon 14 years of success.

The biggest factor behind the acquisition was funding. In the early years of operation, the MFSRSC operated on a yearly budget around \$600,000, with a healthy amount coming from grants and the rest from rental fees, concessions, or other services provided by the facility. Each year the operating budget was slowly decreased and grant funding became scarce. Through it all, the complex prevailed.

"I am extremely proud of the great work the staff has done in keeping the operation running smoothly, however the current model of funding for SRSC is not sustainable." Scott Prillaman, former Chairman of the SVRFA

Board of Directors, said in a July release. "It is our belief that the continued operation of a premier facility can best be accomplished by Henry County."

People within the Henry County Board of Supervisors also saw the benefit of helping contribute to a facility that brings revenue to the community on a weekly basis through events like the Cardinal Cup Lacrosse Tournament or Piedmont Youth Soccer League's Piedmont Shootout. In 2022 alone, over 400 teams from 25 states and nine different countries flocked to MFSRSC, many of whom stayed in local hotels and ate at local restaurants.

"I knew that the Complex had a reputation for being a first-class facility and the staff did an awesome job, especially with the somewhat limited resources that they had," said Roger Adams, Director of Henry County Parks and Recreation. "I knew that a lot of teams came from out of town to play at the Sports Complex, but I was still surprised at just how many people there were at some of the weekend tournaments."

At the time of the acquisition, the MFSRSC had only four full-time staff members at the facility to maintain, schedule, plan, and execute year-round events that included activities each weekend and over 300 days of the year in 2022. Now, with access to a larger maintenance staff and additional resources through the Parks and Recreation department, the Complex and its visitors are going to see improvements all around.

"Having more hands to help with simple projects that allow the staff we have to focus on bigger projects within our dedicated job, that's going to do wonders for the facility," said Houston Stutz, MFSRSC Director of Operations. "Our grass playing fields are already seeing the benefit of getting the care they need instead of our one facility manager having to dedicate a lot of time to the surfaces or landscaping outside of the fields."

Adams and Stutz are both excited about the new partnership and what having more resources and funding could mean for the facility moving forward. Adams said he anticipates an extensive list of projects on the landscaping and maintenance front to be completed within the next year. On down the road, the two would like to see a fieldhouse completed with showers and locker rooms, while also looking at the possibility of additional seating on the two stadium turf fields.

The benefit of a large scale project to add more amenities would open the possibility of MFSRSC hosting more state tournament events at the high school level or national events at the college or club level. Tournament organizers have brought events such as the 2021 Virginia High School League Class 3A state soccer semifinal and the 2015 NJCAA Division II Men's Soccer National Championships to Martinsville in the past. Hosting requirements have since changed for both events, but both or similar events are ones that SRSC and HCPR would love to see back in Martinsville-Henry County.

"It's a really exciting time for everyone involved at the Monogram Foods Smith River Sports Complex," Stutz said. "We all can't wait to see what the future holds."

Exciting Lineup Martinsville Speedway

ith 2023 being NASCAR's 75th Anniversary, just one year after Martinsville Speedway celebrated its own 75-year milestone, the famous track, situated in the heart of Martinsville-Henry County, will feature an exciting lineup of events entering 2024, after a monumental 2023.

NASCAR reached new heights as it took to the streets of Chicago for its first-ever street race, then continued through a calendar filled with track diversity including road courses, superspeedways, and the almighty short tracks. Coming off back-to-back sellouts for the fall Playoff race, NASCAR and Martinsville Speedway, two organizations entwined with rich history, are eager for racing to return to the historic half-mile this season.

Founded in 1947 by H. Clay Earles, Martinsville Speedway is a short track known for its distinctive paperclip shape, scenic Norfolk Southern Railway behind the backstretch, iconic Martinsville Grandfather clock trophy, famous Martinsville hot dogs and its truly authentic, traditional race experience.

On Sept. 7, 1947, Martinsville Speedway held its first race, three months before NASCAR was officially created, with 9,013 fans and 750 seats ready on its original dirt

track. On Sept. 25, 1949, future NASCAR Hall of Famer Red Byron won the first NASCAR race held at the Martinsville Speedway dirt track. Bill France Sr., founder of NASCAR and inaugural inductee to the NASCAR Hall of Fame, joined Earles as a 50-percent partner on the track in the early 1950's.

Martinsville Speedway remains the only NASCAR track to host NASCAR Cup Series races every year since the organization's inception in 1949. The track was paved in 1955 and remains the shortest track on the Cup Series schedule at .526 miles. Its width is 55 feet with 800foot asphalt straights and tight 588-foot concrete turns, banked at 12 degrees.

"Martinsville Speedway has always been, and continues to be, a place for family and friends to come and experience the joy of racing," said Clay Campbell, President of Martinsville Speedway. "The generations of history that run through every crack in the pavement and every seat in the stands are what brings this place to life. With some of the best short-track racing in the country, paired with the support of our fans and community, Martinsville Speedway possesses an incredible atmosphere that not many other places have."

It wasn't until 1964 that the famous Martinsville



Speedway Grandfather clock trophy came to be. Nearly two decades after that first race, Earles decided it was time for a "different" type of trophy for race winners. That year, the track introduced the Martinsville Grandfather clock in Victory Lane, won by Fred Lorenzen, and it's been a tradition-rich token ever since.

"It's important to win that race and of course, I loved that track," NASCAR Hall of Famer and 11-time Martinsville winner Darrell Waltrip said when speaking on his success at the track. "It just meant the world to me to win there. Those clocks are special. With the Azalea bushes that used to be there and parking on the back straightaway with the coaches, it's evolved, but it's still Martinsville, same old racetrack."

Earles remained chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Martinsville Speedway until his death on Nov. 16, 1999. In 2017, he was recognized with the NASCAR Hall of Fame Landmark Award. His grandson, Clay Campbell, carried on his legacy by joining Martinsville Speedway in 1978 and becoming track president in 1988. Campbell is the longest serving track president in NASCAR and has continued to lead Martinsville Speedway's success at the track and the organization's active role in the local community.

"I've been coming to Martinsville since 1949, when NASCAR held its first Cup race," said Richard Petty, seventime NASCAR Cup Series champion and all-time wins leader (15) at Martinsville Speedway. "I don't remember the hot dogs starting that early but racing definitely did. I consider Martinsville to be our home track since it's right up the road from the house. I always enjoy coming here and seeing who will take home the next clock."

In 2017, Martinsville Speedway became the first major motorsports facility in the nation to install LED lights. In the fall of that year, Martinsville's Cup Series race was the first to finish under the lights at the track. Since then, Martinsville Speedway has hosted multiple night races, increasing the intensity for fans and drivers. This past year, the track made updates to the hospitality experiences offered with Club Panorama, located between turns 1 and 2, featuring one of the best views in racing.

In 2022, the track made history when Ross Chastain raced his way into the Championship 4, putting his car in the wall and propelling himself around the outside of the half-mile track in his famous video game inspired "hail melon" move. This past season, Ryan Blaney took home a victory, earning a spot in the Championship 4 which

ultimately put him in the position he needed to win the title of 2023 NASCAR Cup Series Champion.

Looking ahead to the 2024 season, Martinsville Speedway will host a pair of triple-header NASCAR race weekends in both the spring and fall. In April, all three national series will compete at the historic short track, with the NASCAR CRAFTSMAN Truck Series on Friday, April 5, at 7:30 p.m., the NASCAR Xfinity Series on Saturday, April 6, at 7:30 p.m., and the NASCAR Cup Series on Sunday, April 7, at 3:00 p.m.

Then, in November, the NASCAR Playoffs return to Martinsville Speedway, in the penultimate race of the 2024 season, setting the field for each series' Championship 4 in Phoenix. It begins on Friday, Nov. 1, with the CRAFTSMAN Truck Series at 6:00 p.m., followed by the Xfinity Series on Saturday, Nov. 2, at 3:00 p.m. The action comes to a close on Sunday, Nov. 3, with the Cup Series Xfinity 500 at 2:00 p.m. Martinsville will also host the Whelen Modified Tour season finale once again on Thursday, Oct. 26.

The ValleyStar Credit Union 300, the nation's biggest, richest and most prestigious NASCAR Late Model Stock Car race, will return for an evening of intense competition next fall, on Saturday, Sept. 28.

A Dream Begins: The Origins of the M-HC Chamber of Commerce

n a cold February day in 1959, thirteen civicminded people gathered at the First National Bank of Martinsville and Henry County to convene the first meeting of what was then called the Martinsville Area Chamber of Commerce.

That first meeting was the result of a community-wide effort, led by local business leaders who knew the value a Chamber could bring to their community.

A history of the Chamber, believed to have been compiled by its first secretary and receptionist India Craddock, attributes its origins to the efforts of one man and "one of our much loved citizens," Heck A. Ford. Ford, the history states, spent a number of years handling the inquiries and correspondence that usually falls to a Chamber. Additionally, "he issued a very informative fact sheet on Martinsville and was instrumental in wooing some of our most recent industries to the Henry County area." So instrumental was Ford, in fact, "for many years we referred to him as Martinsville's 'One Man Chamber of Commerce."

After Ford's passing in 1955, Sutt Flythe, president of the First National Bank and chair of the Kiwanis Public Affairs Committee, assumed many of Ford's duties. He quickly recognized the need for a formal, dedicated organization to fill this role.

Together with the Kiwanis Club and eight other prominent local clubs and associations, like the Exchange Club and Business and Professional Women's Club, Flythe formed a committee to explore establishing a Chamber. This group, chaired by William F. Franck of Sale Knitting Company, also included John Jordan, Jim Montgomery, Dan Greene, Charles Broun, J. Shelton Scales, Joseph Howell, and Flythe. They were joined by Verbon Kemp, the Executive Director of the Virginia State Chamber of Commerce. Together, the group recommended uniting to launch a new Chamber of Commerce for Martinsville and Henry County.

Martinsville's Front Door Opens

In May 1959, the newly formed Chamber elected Franck as its first president. In the Martinsville Bulletin, Franck advocated for the role of the Chamber as the new "front door" for the community - a hub to support existing business, attract new enterprises, and facilitate development.

"We, the citizens of Martinsville, live in an area of Virginia that promises great opportunity for the future," he wrote. "Martinsville is a good place to call "Home". In past years its business and civic leaders have seen to it that a steady program of growth and development prevailed here. We are fast approaching a new era of business and industrial growth."

New people would be coming to Martinsville, he wrote, as would out-of-town visitors, seeking information about the area.

"Where do they go to get this?" Franck asked. "Where is the 'Front Door?' THERE IS NONE! An efficient Chamber might well answer this need."

A Chamber of Commerce could improve business and build a better, stronger community, he argued. "It is the necessary vehicle through which it is possible to combine forces for executing a continuous year-after-year program of work sorely needed for community development." Ultimately, Franck said, "There is no other type of organization that can provide such a central meeting ground for all walks of business life, doing jobs that no one individual can do alone."

The Chamber set up headquarters in a home on 115 Broad Street (the former home of Miss Janie Lavinder) with a sign proudly declaring "Martinsville Area Chamber of Commerce: Visitors Welcome." The Chamber's history notes that the first out-of-town visitors to the new office were Mr. and Mrs. Eugene G. Jones of Birmingham, AL, who stopped in to request a map of Martinsville. Mr. Jones, recently discharged from the Air Force, had accepted a position with a local industrial firm and he and his wife were searching for an apartment in the city.

An Expanding Regional Role

As inquiries and guests arrived through their front door, the new Chamber of Commerce was rapidly working to unite the business community in support of its mission. Within months, they had hired Jeff Warner as the Chamber's first manager and leaders like membership committee chairman Leon Globman had raised \$16,000 of a \$20,000 first-year fundraising goal and announced a membership of over 150 businesses.

Some of those original Chamber members included Frith Construction, Globman's, the Martinsville Bulletin, McCollum-Ferrell, Zentmeyer Coal & Oil Company, The Music Bar, Harry L. Nunn Grocery, C.P. Kearfott & Son Inc., Piedmont Trust Bank, Leggett's Department Store, Lacy Manufacturing, and many more.

Less than a year later, that membership had nearly doubled to almost 300. The Chamber was rapidly growing, and ready to become a powerful player in shaping the future of Martinsville and Henry County.

In February 1960, the organization updated its name to the Martinsville-Henry County Chamber of Commerce, recognizing its growing reach and regional focus across areas key to the textiles, manufacturing, and agricultural economy. That same month, the Chamber officially became affiliated with the national Chamber of Commerce of the United States.

Championing Education and Workforce Development

The newly-formed Chamber quickly got to work on its six-pronged Program of Action. One area of focus for the Chamber was bolstering education. To that end, in 1961, the organization led efforts to establish educational infrastructure essential for economic development. Chamber President Francis T. West and other leaders invited over 100 regional representatives to come together to explore the possibility of establishing a community college in the area.

They formed a College Steering Committee and collaborated with the University of Virginia. By January 1962, the Martinsville Bulletin shared the good news - a new UVA branch college was slated to open in the area the following fall. Soon after, the paper announced that prospective students could begin applying for admission. Tuition would be \$400 for a year, \$472 for part-time and evening students.

Thanks to the Chamber's convening power, Patrick & Henry Community College was born - filling workforce needs and expanding higher education access in Martinsville, Henry County, and surrounding areas.

Partnering for Economic Growth

Over the next decades, the Chamber expanded programming and cemented itself as a leader in regional development and driver for economic growth. In 1962, the Chamber brought together county and city leaders to establish a County-City Airport Study Commission to improve access to the area by air.



Soon after, the land for what is now the Blue Ridge Regional Airport was purchased.

When the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) catalyzed declines in local textiles and furniture in the 1990s, the Chamber partnered with other groups leading renewal efforts, like the Martinsville Uptown Revitalization Association (MURA) founded in 1992.

As MURA's funding declined in the 2010s, they approached the Chamber, hoping a merger could sustain their Main Street revitalization mission. In 2015, MURA merged into the Chamber's Partnership for Economic Growth (C-PEG) and became Martinsville Uptown - a partnership exemplifying the Chamber's convening power for regional economic development.

Martinsville Uptown carries on MURA's work to revitalize the uptown district using the Main Street Approach and signature events that draw tourists while also directly supporting uptown businesses.

Continuing a Legacy, Building the Future

Over its 65-year history, the MHC Chamber of Commerce has convened business, civic, and government leaders to support growth across Martinsville and Henry County.

While trade dynamics shifted the shape of local industry, the Chamber provided continuity of purpose and expanded programming to meet community needs. 

Commonwealth Crossing Business Centre: Paving the Way for Economic Advancement in Martinsville-Henry County



ommonwealth Crossing Business Centre (CCBC), positioned along the Virginia/North Carolina border adjacent to U.S. Route 220, stands as a beacon of economic development in Martinsville-Henry County. With recent announcements, the industrial park is not only making history but also signaling a bright future for the region.

In August of 2023, Press Glass announced a \$155.2 million investment to expand their production facility at Commonwealth Crossing. Press Glass, the largest independent flat glass processing operation in Europe, is set to further solidify its U.S. presence and manufacturing power by doubling its workforce and facility. The expansion, slated to create 335 new jobs, is the largest single capital investment by a business in Henry County's history. The decision to invest in the facility, which will add an additional 360,000 square-feet, speaks volumes about the attractiveness of Commonwealth Crossing and the surrounding region.

Commonwealth Crossing has seen growth not only at Press Glass, but also with its second tenant, Crown Holdings. The aluminum beverage can manufacturer opened and subsequently expanded their facility in 2022 creating 126 jobs with a combined total of \$165 million in capital investment. With its success in attracting industry leaders like Press Glass and Crown Holdings, the business park's future looks promising. Virginia Business Ready Sites Program (VBRSP) grant funds of just over \$22 million allocated for the development of Tract 2 add another layer to the park's potential. Tract 2, initially marketed as a 200-acre site with a 57-acre graded pad, is now set to become one of the largest contiguous industrial sites ever developed in Martinsville-Henry County.

RESSGLAS

The combination of VBRSP funds and a \$6 million grant from the Harvest Foundation will guarantee the grading of Tract 2, transforming it into a 150-acre pad site.

The expansion of Tract 2 is a significant step toward enhancing the park's offerings. At the heart of Commonwealth Crossing is the Commonwealth Center for Advanced Training (CCAT), a state-of-the-art training facility that opened its doors in October 2019. CCAT—a collaboration between the Martinsville-Henry County Economic Development Corporation (EDC) and Henry County-represents a commitment to workforce development and advanced manufacturing. The 25,889 square-foot training center offers incoming industries access to office space and a high-bay area to jump-start production while their facility is constructed. Commonwealth Crossing Business Centre stands at the intersection of vision, collaboration, and strategic development. The recent Press Glass announcement and the allocation of significant grant funds for Tract 2 underscore the park's role as a catalyst for economic growth in Martinsville-Henry County and beyond. As the park continues to evolve, it is poised to write a compelling chapter in the region's economic success story-attracting businesses, creating jobs, and contributing to the vibrant, prosperous future of the community.




